**YOUNG, DEVVARMAN , BALL, and MATOSEVIC, SEMIFINALISTS;
In Doubles, Top Seeded Ratiwatana Brothers Defeated**

APTOS, CA—American player Donald Young of Atlanta, the #3 seed of the tournament, won his match against the #5 seed, Serbian player Ilija Bozoljac tonight at the Comerica Bank Challenger in straight sets, 6-3, 6-4, and advanced to the semi-finals. Tomorrow he will meet the formidable Somdev Devvarman of India, second seed, who won his match against Alex Bogdanovic of Great Britain in a tight match, 7-5, 4-6, 6-0. Carsten Ball of Australia, the fourth seed, defeated countryman Brydan Klein, 6-1, 7-6(4), and will face another Australian tomorrow: Marinko Matosevic. Matosevic eliminated German player Simon Stadler today, 6-4, 7-6(4).

Both Devvarman and Young have gathered steam during their matches during this tournament, apparently gaining confidence, rhythm and strategy even as their opponents forced them into third sets.

Today's match for Devvarman was a good example of this, as he seemed to falter during the second set, but practically breezed through the last one. He produced a similar strong finale in his first-round match against Japanese player Yuichi Sugita, which he won 5-7, 6-2, 6-0.

In Young's previous two matches, he lost the first set, and won the final two. He commented afterward that he felt he'd lacked confidence in those early sets. But after today's win, he said that this play was more characteristic of how he's been playing throughout the year—the kind of play that earned him a Challenger title in Carson. "I served better; all my shots were cleaner. Hopefully this continues throughout the tournament."

Bozoljac took a medical time-out during the second set, receiving attention to his right arm and elbow. "Yeah, but he was still serving pretty hard," said Young. "His serve is definitely his weapon. That, and his backhand. It's hard, and flat."

In doubles matches, Australian team Adam Feeney and Greg Jones advanced to the semi-finals, eliminating #1 seeded team and last year's Comerica Bank Challenger finalists, the Ratiwatana brothers of Thailand, 6-2, 6-3.

Semi-final play will start tomorrow at 11:00 a.m., when Marinko Matosevic meets Carsten Ball. That match is followed by Young vs. Devvarman, and after an appropriate rest, a doubles match between Devin Britton and Donald Young vs. Carsten Ball and Chris Guccione to determine who will meet Feeney and Jones in the finals on Sunday.

**DEVVARMAN, BALL ADVANCE TO QUARTERFINALS;
In Doubles, Britton and Young Prevail**

APTOS, CA—Somdev Devvarman of India, the #2 seed of the Comerica Bank Challenger this year, eliminated US player Alex Bogomolov in three tight sets, 6-2, 5-7, 6-4. Devvarman, a two-time NCAA champion, will meet Britain's Alex Bogdanovic on the court tomorrow in the quarterfinals. Bogdanovic advanced today when his opponent Karol Beck, of Slovakia, withdrew before the match, due to a bad shoulder.

Every point was hard-earned in the match between Devvarman and Bogomolov today, as they pushed each other to give their all. Devvarman commented that during the second set, he felt like it was getting away from him, "but once I broke him, I started feeling the ball a little better, and played two good games. It wasn't that he played any bad games, but I played two good games."

He acknowledged that Bogomolov is excellent on offense: "He's the kind of player that loves to take control of the point, and I felt like I was letting him do that too much. Towards the end of the 3rd set I started putting the ball a little deeper in his court, and that seemed to work. He played really well today, and forced me to do my best."

Carsten Ball, of Australia, the #4 seed, also defeated Alex Kuznetsov of the US, 6-7(6), 6-1, 6-4, Nick Lindahl, 6-3, 6-2. Tomorrow Ball will face Brydan Klein, of the Australia, who defeated his opponent, Peter Polansky of Canada, 6-3, 6-4.

In doubles matches, Devin Britton and Donald Young, a wildcard team from the US, eliminated John Paul Fruttero of the US and Brydan Klein of Australia in a closely contested match, 4-6, 7-5, 11-9. The #1 seeded team and last year's Comerica Bank Challenger finalists, the Ratiwatana brothers of Thailand, narrowly defeated freshmen players Chase Buchanan and Bradley Klan of the US, 7-6(3), 5-7, 10-8, while the #2 seeded team, Carsten Ball and Chris Guccione of Australia, defeated Canadian team, 7-6(4), 6-2. Meanwhile, Australian team Adam Feeney and Greg Jones also eliminated the #4 seed team Pierre-Ludovic Duclos, of Canada and Adam Sitak of Russia, eliminated, 6-4, 7-5

Play will start tomorrow at 11:00 a.m., with a match between Australia's Marinko Matosevic and Germany's Simon Stadler. In the feature match, which will not begin before 5:00 pm, #5 seed Ilija Bozoljac will face #3 seed Donald Young.

**YOUNG, MARINKO, ADVANCE TO QUARTERFINALS;
In Doubles, Qualifying Team Frutter and Klein defeat Wimbledon veterans Huey
and Inglot**

APTOS, CA— In the feature singles match today, US player Donald Young defeated Artem Sitak, of Russia, 1-6, 6-4, 6-4. Young said he was feeling less than confident throughout that first set, but then switched rackets, and his play seemed to go better, though Sitak was not giving up any easy points. “He made me play my best game possible,” said Young.

The 20-year-old, who holds the 2007 Comerica Bank Challenger title, seemed to be at his best during rallies, when he was able to bring his opponent up to the net, and then drive a strong return into the outside corner. “It was not intentional,” he admitted. “I was playing defense better than offense. Everybody else is serving really well, and I’m going to work on that.”

Marinko Matosevic, who plays for Australia but is originally from Australia, also prevailed over South African player Izak Van Der Merwe 6-4, 6-4. Number 5 seed Serbian Ilija Bozoljac also advanced to quarterfinals after defeating Canadian Milos Raonic, 3-6, 6-2, 6-3; and Simon Stadler stays in, having eliminated Australian player Nick Lindahl, 6-3, 6-2. And in the last match of the first round, Qualifier Karol Beck of Slovakia defeated Frederik Nielsen of Denmark, 7-6(5), 6-2.

In doubles matches, the top two seeds and last year’s Comerica Bank Challenger finalists, the Ratiwatana brothers of Thailand, and Carsten Ball and Chris Guccione of Australia, won their respective matches. Meanwhile, qualifying team John-Paul Fruttero of the United States and Brydan Klein of Australia unseated #3 doubles seed Treat Conrad Huey, of the Philippines, and Dominic Inglot, of Great Britain, 2-6, 6-3, 10-4.

Huey and Inglot arrived in Aptos after beating the #1 doubles team in the world at Wimbledon recently in the second round.

Play will start tomorrow at 11:00 a.m. In the feature match, which will not begin before 5:30, India's Somdev Devvarman, the #2 seed of the tournament, will face off against Alex Bogomolov of the United States.

**LONG MATCHES AS PLAYERS BATTLE TO STAY IN CHALLENGER:
Top Seeds Devvarman, Ball prevail; Guccione Falls to Van Der Merwe**

APTOS, CA— Matches stretched on for hours today as players laid it on the line to stay in the Comerica Bank Challenger tournament. Many of the matches were close, going into third sets and testing the players' stamina and poise, especially during the heat of the afternoon.

The last two matches, between South African Izak Van Der Merwe and Australian Chris Guccione, and between Yuichi Sugita of Japan and Somdev of India, were pushed back until evening, and both of these matches were also tightly contested.

As the shadows lengthened on Center Court, finally Van Der Merwe, a 26-year-old from South Africa with a current ranking of 260, defeated defending Comerica Bank champion Chris Guccione, age 24, currently ranked at 214 after an injury kept him out of play for six months last year. The final score was 3-6, 6-3, 6-4.

Van Der Merwe talked about his strategy after the match. "Well, [Guccione] has a really big serve, and hits a lot of winners, so it's tough to get into the match, and I wasn't returning well at the beginning. But then I figured out how to make some returns and had some more success...I made him play a lot."

Van Der Merwe was clearly at the top of his game today, with smooth, carefully controlled shots. Especially toward the end, as game after game went to deuce multiple times, many in the crowd were cheering for defending champion Guccione, but were still applauding for Van Der Merwe's terrific plays. As one Guccione fan admitted about Van Der Merwe, "The kid's got game."

Although Van Der Merwe mostly remembered Guccione's winners, both players displayed tremendous athleticism, and delivered some fine rallies throughout the match, including some artistically placed returns that drew admiration from the crowd.

Meanwhile, Devvarman, the #2 seed in the tournament, prevailed over his opponent, Sugita. The match started out tough for Devvarman, but he found a rhythm that pulled him through the second and third set with ease: the final score was 5-7, 6-2, 6-0.

Number 4 seed Carsten Ball of Australia stayed in the tournament by eliminating countryman Joseph Sirianna in close match, 7-6(7), 6-4, and Brydan Klein of Australia advanced to the second round after defeating young wildcard Devin Britton of the United States, age 19, in a two-hour battle, 7-5, 3-6, 6-4. Similarly, Alex Kuznetsov, a 23-year-old player ranked 167 in the world, advanced to the next round, but was tested on the court today in a long, hot afternoon match by 19-year-old Australian Dayne Kelly, for a final score of 1-6, 6-3, 6-4.

In other matches, Russian player Artem Sitak defeated Takao Suzuki of Japan, 6-4, 6-3; Alex Bogdanovich defeated fellow Brit Richard Bloomfield Brit, 6-3, 6-4; and Alex Bogomolov Jr., United States, defeated wildcard Bradley Klahn, also of the United States, 6-2, 6-0.

One of the most dramatic matches of the day was a doubles match played by four phenomenal athletes. Ilija Bozoljac of Serbia and Kevin Kim of the United States teamed up and met wildcard team Devin Britton and Donald Young of the United States.

Bozoljac comes to the Comerica Bank Challenger after advancing to the second round of Wimbledon and playing a tough match against Federer; Kim is a two-time returning Comerica champion, with a 2004 and a 2008 title; Young is also a returning champion, with the 2007 title, which he won at age 17, making him the youngest player ever to win it; and Britton is the 2009 NCAA Champion.

None of these players were holding back today, and were blasting their serves; many of the points gained were those lost by the opposing team, when balls went long or straight into the net. It was exciting tennis to watch, for a final score of 4-3, 6-3, 10-6. The end of the match was marred by a call that was disputed by Young, and an ensuing argument between Bozoljac and the umpire staff about the rules of the game. Up until that point, however, the most outstanding performance by all four was on the court.

SEASCAPE CURSE CONTINUES: #1 SEED RAM ELIMINATED IN FIRST ROUND, ALONG WITH TWO OTHER TOP SEEDS, KIM AND YANI

APTOS, CA— Three of the top-seeded players in the \$75,000 Comerica Bank Challenger were eliminated today in the first round of play. In the feature match, Australian Marinko Matosevic defeated the tournament's #1 seed Rajeev Ram, of the United States, in straight sets, 6-1, 6-1. In two other similar routs, German player Simon Stadler prevailed over the #8 seed, US player Michael Yani, 6-0, 6-1, while Canada's Peter Polansky steam-rolled the #6 seed, Kevin Kim, also from the US. 6-1, 6-1.

Ram's elimination from the tournament perpetuates the "Seascape Curse." Throughout the event's history, now a solid 24 year time span, not a single top seed has won the Challenger title at Aptos, one of the largest Challenger purses in the country.

Matosevic, who is originally from Croatia, was upbeat after the match as he commented on the win. He explained that he had a tough spring, with some injuries and illness, but that he felt his game was becoming more consistent. He recently made the finals in Ojai, and said he was glad to be in California. "It's a great venue here, and the housing is a great set-up," he said, smiling. "I feel good."

In general, it was a rough day for US players as well as top-seeded players. Out of seven singles matches that pitted US players against those playing for other countries, the only US player to win was Donald Young, the #4 seed at this year's tournament.

In doubles, however, the #2 seeded team of John Paul Fruttero (United States) and Brydan Klein (Australia) defeated the #1 seeded team, Mao-Xin Gong and Zhe Li, both of China, 6-4, 7-6. Meanwhile, wildcard team Chase Buchanan and Bradley Klahn, both 19-year-old rising stars in US collegiate tennis, beat seasoned players Slovakian Karol Beck, ranked #89 in the world in singles, and Ukrainian Sergei Bubka.

KIDS' DAY AT COMERICA BANK CHALLENGER

It was also a day for making very young players feel good today here at the Seascape Sports Club. About 160 kids from the YMCA and from Seaside came to the club to get tennis lessons with the pros.

Rick Kepler is one of those pros, and is also Tennis Director of the Club. He said it was “awesome,” and “a great day.” “A lot of these kids are playing for the first time, and they’re soaking it all in, and some of them, you can tell they have never had a lesson in anything, because they can’t afford it,” he said. “It’s really touching.”

He said he is always impressed by the way the pro circuit players come through for the kids, too. This year, players Alex Bogdanovic, of Great Britain, Adam Kelly of Australia, Matt Fawcett, of South Africa, and Jordan Kepler of the US were some of the players who participated, along with Club pros Emilio Escalante and himself.
