## FORMER NO. 8 RADEK STEPANEK TO PLAY IN COMERICA BANK CHALLENGER QUALIFIYING ROUNDS

**Former world No. 8 Radek Stepanek** from Czech Republic will compete in the qualifying rounds for a spot in the main draw of the \$100,000 Comerica Bank Challenger.

**Stepanek**, 36, reached a career high singles ranking of No. 8 back in 2006 and a career high doubles ranking of No. 4 in 2012. He won the 2012 **Australian Open doubles title** and the 2013 **U.S. Open doubles title**. He has played mostly Challenger events in 2015 and in July, he clinched a doubles title in Columbia with partner Edouard Roger-Vasselin.

American players, 23 year-old **Clay Thompson** and 21 year-old **Dennis Novikov** are returning to Aptos also to fight for a spot in the main draw.

With the amount of potential for this weekend's qualifying players, it goes without being said the talent runs deep this year at Seascape.

It is likely that former world No. 2, Tommy Haas will play in the first feature match on Tuesday, August 11<sup>th</sup> at 6 p.m.

**The qualifying rounds are free of charge for fans** and are set to begin at 10 a.m. this Saturday, August 8<sup>th</sup> and continue throughout Sunday.
