## U.S. OPEN WILDCARD UP FOR GRABS AT APTOS

Upon the conclusion of the \$100,000 Comerica Bank Challenger, the USTA awards a **main draw wildcard into the U.S. Open** to the American male who accumulates the most ranking points from **two of the following four pro circuit events**: **Binghampton**, **Lexington**, **Vancouver and Aptos**.

It was **23-year-old Stanford alum, Bradley Klahn** that solidified the U.S. Open Wildcard last year after his win against Russian, **Evgeny Donskoy** in the semifinals at Seascape. Both Klahn and Donskoy are set to compete in this year's challenger once again.

Veteran to the Seascape Challenger, **Wayne Odesnik** currently **leads the American pack** this summer after advancing to the finals in Binghampton and the semifinals in Lexington just last week.

Due to the very competitive draw this year with **no player exceeding higher** than No. 190 in the rankings, Odesnik will have to fight his way through the qualifying rounds in order secure a spot in the main draw at Aptos.
